### No Internet Access

What else can you do with your children at home?

- Make paper aeroplanes. Whose flies the furthest?
- Find some old family photos and talk about the past. Write a sentence to describe each photo or complete a speech bubble to show what everyone is saying
- Bake a cake or follow a recipe
- Scavenger hunt - find something in your home or outside beginning with each letter of the alphabet or colours of the rainbow
- Make a 'den' in your home or outside
- Learn to tie shoelaces or tie your hair in a ponytail
- Learn to skip or juggle
- Make play dough or salt dough (see recipe below)
- Write a letter or a card to someone you are not able to see at the moment
- Make a kite. Can you make it fly?
- Design a treasure hunt for your family
- Learn how to make a cup of tea or boil an egg (with adult help!)
- Create a shop using things in your home – practise buying items and giving change using real coins
- Go on a 2D or 3D shape hunt in your house or outside. How many shapes can you see? Can you name the shapes?
- Write a diary of life during lockdown
- Learn to tell the time or practise your times tables

### **Easy Play Dough Recipe**

You will need:

- 8 tablespoons plain flour
- 2 tablespoons table salt
- 60ml warm water
- food colouring
- 1 tbsp vegetable oil

Steps

1. Mix the flour and salt in a large bowl. In a separate bowl mix together the water, a few drops of food colouring and the oil.
2. Pour the coloured water into the flour mix and bring together with a spoon.
3. Dust a work surface with a little flour and turn out the dough. Knead together for a few minutes to form a smooth dough.
4. Store in a plastic sandwich bag (squeeze out the air) in the fridge to keep it fresh.

### **Salt Dough Recipe**

You will need:

- 250g plain flour
- 125g salt
- 125ml water

Steps

1. Preheat the oven to its lowest setting and line a baking sheet with baking parchment.
2. Mix the flour and salt in a large bowl. Add the water and stir until it comes together into a ball.
3. Transfer the dough to a floured work surface and shape into your chosen model. You can roll it out and cut out shapes, numbers or letters using biscuit cutters, or make any kind of model you can think of.
4. Put your finished items on the lined baking sheet and bake for 3 hours or until solid.
5. Leave to cool and then paint.
